MORNING PRAYER

Monday

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

REFLECTION

We say *Amen* all the time, but rarely give any thought to what it means.

Amen is the Hebrew word for *Yes*. But in the Hebrew language, there is more than one word for *Yes*.

For informal, everyday purposes they use another word, which sounds a bit like *Ken*.

The word *Amen* is reserved for more solemn, formal meaningful occasions, and it means '*I firmly agree,*' or '*When I say Yes, trust me, I mean it seriously*'.

So when do *you* say *Amen*?

The most important regular occasions that you say *Amen* is when the priest says '*This is the Body of Christ*', or when you add your own *Amen* to a prayer that someone is making on behalf of everyone in church to God.

In other words, your *Amen* is your 'word of honour' and a statement of commitment and solemn agreement.

REFLECTION

This week on the 25th March the Church celebrates the greatest occasion when a human being ever said the word *Amen*.

The Solemn Feast of the Annunciation.

The 25th March is exactly nine months away from Christmas, when we celebrate the birth of Jesus.

For that reason, the Church chose to celebrate the visit of the Angel Gabriel to Mary, when he announced Almighty God's message of joy to her, and she gave her great and solemn *Amen* in reply.

And so, with her solemn consent, the Holy Spirit overshadowed her, and the Son of God was conceived in her womb.

In that sense you are the fruit of your own mother's *Amen*.

But assuming that she was married in Church, the biggest *Amens* your mother have ever said were the threefold *Amens* that she said when she made her marriage vows to your father.

That was the solemn moment of her commitment to him for life, and him to her.

Next Sunday is Mother's Day, so remember to say a prayer of thanksgiving to her for all that she has done for you, and give her a small token of your love, maybe by doing something extra for her.
