REFLECTION

In the next few days we celebrate the Feast of our Guardian Angels and the Feast of the Archangels, so this week we take Angels as our theme.

Catholics believe in Angels: The scriptures are full of references to Angels, and the tradition of the Church has always included Angels in prayers, liturgies and other writings.

We might ask what are Angels like? How do we imagine them? Unlike us, they are entirely spiritual in nature, so it is hard to imagine them at all, but we know that like us, they are created by God, along with the rest of creation.

Think of Angels as *bright* creatures; They are bright because they reflect their Creator, who is Lightness personified. Moreover, they're bright because they have such great knowledge of God;

So we can say that even the least intelligent human being has an Angel watching over him or her, who is infinitely more intelligent than all the wisest and cleverest people in the history of the world put together!

REFLECTION

From Sacred Scripture, we know the names of various types of Angels, and indeed the names of particular Angels. Here are some:

The *Cherubim* serve to bring God Himself towards his creation. The Hebrew root of the word means 'greatness', and they are the greatest of Angels because of their closeness to Almighty God, as God-bearers.

The *Seraphim* from the Hebrew word meaning 'to burn', are described as surrounding God like burning flames, and singing the glory of God. We use their song of praise in the *Sanctus* at Mass:- 'Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts' etc.

But above all, we know the names of three particular Archangels whose names describe their function of service to God:-

Mic-aEL which means 'who is like God' in Hebrew; He fights a war in the Book of the Apocalypse against Satan, the fallen angel.

Raph-aEL which means the 'the God who heals'; He is the patron of students, especially, of course, students of medicine. Gab-riEL means 'The power of God'. He is the bearer of the good news of Christ, and brings that news first to Our Lady.

REFLECTION

An Angel appears to Jesus in his agony to comfort him.

On Easter morning, Angels in the form of young men in glowing robes guard the tomb, and announce to the women the news that the Lord has risen from the dead,

And at the Last Judgement, Scripture says that Christ will come, surrounded with Angels.

Each one of us has a Guardian Angel, and they exist to bring Christ and his saving message near to us, and guard us against evil.

They are never far from us, praying for us and for our spiritual safety.

We need to remember that Satan, the fallen angel, wants to tempt us away from Christ and we can ask our Guardian Angel always to protect us from his sinful influence.

Today, in the week when we are reflecting on Angels, let us say together the 1st Joyful Mystery, when the Angel Gabriel brought the Good news of Jesus' birth to his mother Mary.

FIRST JOYFUL MYSTERY: THE ANNUNCIATION
