REFLECTION

This week we reflect on our house saints, and remember to think of them as our patrons;

They have a job to do in heaven for each one of us!

Saint John Fisher was a Yorkshireman, born in 1469.

He was very gifted and went to Cambridge University when he was only 15 years old.

By the age of 18 he had already received his first degree.

He wanted to become a priest, and the Pope gave him special permission to be ordained at the young age of 22.

He went on to become Chancellor of Cambridge University and Bishop of Rochester, which was an important Diocese in England.

John Fisher became an outstanding theologian and writer, and became famous throughout Europe.

However, Fisher refused to accept King Henry VIII as head of the Church of England, and when he was asked to agree to the divorce of the King's marriage to Catherine of Aragon, he simply said the words from the Rite of Marriage:

'Those whom God hath joined together, let no man put asunder'.

As a result, Fisher was executed by order of the King.

He was named a Cardinal by the Pope shortly before his death.

REFLECTION

As one of the Church's greatest scholars, John Fisher spent much time writing articles and books attacking the teachings of Martin Luther.

On one occasion, he was being praised by a monk for his writings, but Fisher replied:

"I wish that instead of spending all my time writing against Luther, I had spent that time praying for him. I am sure it would have been time much better spent!"

In whatever house he was staying, before going to bed, John Fisher would ask if there was any poor person in a nearby house who was likely to die in the night, and if there was, he would spend time with them, leading them in prayer, and helping them prepare for death.

Whenever he was saying Mass, his face would be bathed in tears as he said the Prayers of Consecration.

One day, when John Fisher was in the Tower of London, awaiting his execution, the cook didn't give him anything to eat. Fisher asked why he had been left out.

The cook said he was sorry, but that he had heard from other people that Fisher had already been executed!

The Saint replied "Well tell everyone that until they see my dead body, I'm just as hungry as everyone else in this prison! And if you've already prepared food for me and one day find that I've been executed, then eat my food yourself!"

On the morning of his execution, the Lieutenant of the Tower woke him early at 5am, to tell him he was to be executed at 9am. Fisher replied:

"In which case can you please leave me in peace and let me go back to sleep for two more hours! Its early in the morning!" Later, his guard asked him what clothes he would like to wear. He said "I want to look at my best, because today is my wedding day."
