REFLECTION

St. Thomas Aquinas is the patron saint of students.

Although he lived almost 900 years ago, his writings on philosophy and theology still form the foundations of the Church's teaching.

He has interesting things to say about the pursuit of Wisdom. For Thomas, Wisdom is the understanding of the truth of things.

He says that among all our human pursuits, of all the things we do, the pursuit of wisdom is the ultimate end of a human being.

It is the most noble, and the most useful pursuit, and the one that provides us the greatest joy and satisfaction, and this is because the more we understand the truth of things the more we are called to a better life.

So to be wise is to find truth, which is to find happiness.

Let us ask God to help us realise that in searching for Truth we are searching for Christ, His divine Son.

REFLECTION

Saint Thomas Aquinas has good advice for those who are studying.

He says that when you study anything, you need to have *an end* in mind, which is always to appreciate *the truth* of what you are studying.

In order to achieve that end, your studies need to be narrowly focused, which means avoiding the temptation to get *distracted* in your studies.

This is why he described curiosity as a vice; He said when you're curious, you lose sight of what you're trying to achieve in your studies, and end up wasting your time and becoming tired and disheartened, because you've lost a sense of direction.

Let us pray for those who are beginning to revise for their public exams, that they learn the art of focusing on the goal of their studies, and avoid distractions.

We can think of ourselves as His goal, just as He wants us to think of Him as our goal.
